Don't Make It Easy

For a Thief To Steal Your Wheels

THE BASIC PREVENTION POLICY

- Never leave your car running or the keys in the ignition, even for "just a minute."
- · Always roll up the windows and lock the car, even if it's in front of your home.
- Never leave valuables in plain view, even if your car is locked. Put them in the trunk or at least out of sight.
- · Park in busy and well-lit areas.
- When you pay to park in a lot or garage, only leave the ignition key with the attendant. Make sure no personal information is attached. Do the same when you take your car for repairs.

ADD EXTRA PROTECTION

- Install a mechanical locking device—commonly called clubs, collars, or j-bars—that locks to the steering wheel, column, or brake, preventing the wheel from being turned more than a few degrees.
- Investigate security systems if you live in a high-theft area or drive an automobile that's an attractive target for thieves.

TAKE THE EXTRA STEP

- Copy the VIN and your tag number on a card and keep it in a safe place. If your vehicle is stolen, the police need this information.
- Approach your car with the key in hand. Look around and inside before getting in.
- Be especially alert at intersections, gas stations, ATMs, shopping malls, and convenience and grocery stores—all are windows of opportunity for carjackers.
- Park in well-lit areas with good visibility, close to walkways, stores, and people.
- If the carjacker has a weapon, give up the car with no questions asked.
